# Sign & Date the Envelope

- After you have voted your ballot, remove the top stub from your ballot by tearing at the perforated line.
- Place the ballot in the GREEN return envelope provided.
- Write the ADDRESS where you live in Santa Cruz County on the envelope in the space provided. Do not write your P.O. Box or work address.
- *SIGN* your name on the envelope to the right of the X. If you do not sign your envelope, we can not count your ballot. *Do not let someone else sign your name for you.*
- Write in the DATE you signed the envelope.
- If you cannot sign your name, make a mark by the **X** and have a witness sign in the line provided.

# Mail It On Time!

- A new law allows the county election official to count a vote-by-mail ballot if it is POSTMARKED on or before Election Day and received by the elections official by the Friday following the election.
- Mail early to make sure your ballot is received on time.
- Since this election is being conducted with mail ballots only, the return envelope is postage paid!

**RESOLUTION NO. 284-2014** 

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ, CALIFORNIA, ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2 OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ (LOMPICO WATER), CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPROVING A SPECIAL TAX THEREIN, THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY SAID DISTRICT AND ESTABLISHMENT OF AN APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT

WHEREAS, on this date, this Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 282-2014 entitled "A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz Authorizing Formation of Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water), Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax Therein, Preliminarily Establishing an Appropriations Limit Therefor, Submitting Levy of the Special Tax and the Establishment of the Appropriations Limit to the Qualified Electors Thereof and Approving a Joint Community Facilities Agreement" (the "Resolution of Formation"), ordering the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water) (the "CFD"), authorizing the levy of a special tax on property within the CFD and preliminarily establishing an appropriations limit for the CFD;

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2014, this Board of Supervisors also adopted Resolution No. 283-2014 entitled "A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz, California, Acting As The Legislative Body of Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water), Determining the Necessity to Incur Bonded Indebtedness and Submitting a Proposition to the Qualified Electors Thereof" (the "Resolution Determining Necessity to Incur Bonded Indebtedness"), determining the necessity to incur bonded indebtedness in the maximum aggregate principal amount of up to \$3,200,000 upon the security of said special tax to be levied within the CFD; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of said resolutions, the propositions of the levy of said special tax, the establishment of the appropriations limit and the incurring of the bonded indebtedness must be submitted to the qualified electors of the CFD as required by the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, Section 53311 *et seq.* of the California Government Code (the "Act").

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz acting as the legislative body of the CFD as follows:

1. As authorized by Section 53353.5 of the Act, the three propositions described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be combined into a single ballot measure, the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference incorporated herein. Said form of ballot is hereby approved.

2. This Board of Supervisors hereby finds that more than 12 persons have been registered to vote within the territory of the CFD for each of the ninety (90) days preceding the close of the public hearing heretofore conducted and concluded by this Board of Supervisors for the purposes of these proceedings. Accordingly, pursuant to the Act, this Board of Supervisors finds that for purposes of these

proceedings the qualified electors are the registered voters within the CFD and that the vote shall be by said registered voters, each having one vote.

3. An election is hereby called for the propositions of levying the special tax on the property within the CFD and establishing an appropriations limit for the CFD pursuant to Section 53325.7 of the Act and shall be consolidated with the election on the proposition of authorization of bonded indebtedness, pursuant to Section 53351 of the Act. The language of the proposition to be placed on the ballot is attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

4. The date of the election for the CFD on the proposition of authorizing the bonded indebtedness, authorizing the levy of the special tax and establishing an appropriations limit for the CFD shall be February 24, 2015 or such later date as is consented to by the County Clerk of the County of Santa Cruz (the "County Clerk"). The election shall be conducted by the County Clerk in accordance with the Elections Code. Except as otherwise provided by the Act, the election shall be conducted by mail ballot and in accordance with the provisions of law regulating elections of the CFD insofar as such provisions are determined by the County Clerk to be applicable. The County Clerk is authorized to conduct the election following the adoption of this resolution. All ballots shall be received by, and the County Clerk shall close the election by, 8:00 p.m. on the election day but shall be counted if received by the County Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on February 27, 2015. Pursuant to Section 53326 of the Act, the ballots for the special election shall be distributed by mail to the registered voters within the CFD.

The Board of Supervisors directs the Santa Cruz County Elections Department to provide any and all services necessary for conducting the election and the CFD agrees to pay for said services.

5. In accordance with the Elections Code of the State of California, arguments for and against this measure may be submitted in conformance with California Elections Code and following a deadline as the date after which no arguments for or against the ballot propositions may be submitted to the County Clerk. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Secretary of the CFD to transmit a copy of the foregoing measure to the County's attorney, and directs the County's attorney to prepare and submit to the County Clerk an impartial analysis of the foregoing measure.

6. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to cause to have published in a newspaper of general circulation circulating within the CFD a copy of this Resolution and a copy of the Resolution Determining Necessity to Incur Bonded Indebtedness, as soon as possible after the date of adoption of this Resolution.

7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

PASSED and ADOPTED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz at a regular meeting held the 18th day of November, 2014.

### TAX RATE STATEMENT FOR BOND MEASURE N

Measure N authorizes a special tax based on water meter size for Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water) (hereinafter, the "District") with voter approval by 2/3 of the votes cast. The proceeds of the special tax will pay for debt service on a bond issue in an amount not to exceed \$3,200,000 and administrative costs. The maximum bond issue of \$3,200,000 includes a reserve fund, capitalized interest, cost of issuance, and net proceeds of \$2,750,000 to finance improvements to the existing Lompico County Water District's water system over a 30-year period. Measure N also authorizes an appropriations limit equal to the proceeds of the special taxes.

The special tax will be levied based on whether an assessor's parcel of taxable property (i.e., non-exempt property) is classified as a single-service property, a multi-service property or City property.

"Taxable Single Service Property" means an Assessor's Parcel of Taxable Residential Property that, at the time of formation of the District, is served by, or associated with an existing water meter located either on such Assessor's Parcel or an adjacent Assessor's Parcel, and is not Taxable Multi-Service Property.

"Taxable Multi-Service Property" means an Assessor's Parcel of Taxable Residential Property that, at the time of formation of the District, was developed with more than one dwelling unit, had more than one meter associated with such parcel, or was subject to the Lompico County Water District's Multi-Dwelling Unit Ready to Serve Charge.

"City Property" means that Assessor's Parcel owned by the City of Santa Cruz.

No Special Tax will be levied on a parcel of Taxable Residential Property with an assessed value in the current Fiscal Year of less than \$2,000.

Tables 1 and 2, which were prepared by the County's Financial Advisor, present the Expected Annual Special Tax and the Maximum Annual Special Tax.

#### Expected Tax

Table 1 below shows the expected tax amount for different categories of Taxable Property. The expected amount assumes no delinquencies, and is based on the maximum interest rate that the bonds could bear and includes administrative costs of \$35 per parcel per year. Commencing with the 2015-16 fiscal year, the special tax will be collected in two installments along with property taxes unless the Board of Supervisors specifies another method of collection.

A maximum bond issue of \$3,200,000 with interest assumed at 5.5% could be financed by the special tax levies shown herein, over the next 30 years. Based on the maximum expected bond size, the majority of property owners will pay \$466 annually during the term of the bond issue.

#### Maximum Tax

To provide bond holders with necessary security, the maximum tax shown in Table 2 includes 10% coverage for delinquencies and estimated administration costs of \$35 per unit per year. The maximum special tax rates cannot be exceeded in any of the 30 years. It is possible that the bond issue could be less than the maximum bond of \$3,200,000 authorized by this measure.

### IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS BY COUNTY COUNSEL MEASURE N

If approved by two-thirds of those voting on this matter, the Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water) (hereinafter called the "District") will be authorized to do three things:

1. to incur indebtedness through the issuance of special tax bonds not exceeding \$3,200,000;

 $2. \mbox{ to levy a special tax annually upon non-exempt real properties within the District; and$ 

3. to establish an appropriations limit equal to the proceeds of the special taxes.

The bonds, if issued, would constitute an indebtedness of the District. The funds raised through the sale of the bonds would be used by the District to finance improvements to the current Lompico County Water District water system.

The special tax would be for the purpose of paying the bonded indebtedness and for the costs of administering the District, the tax levy and the bonds. It may be collected in the same manner as property taxes unless otherwise determined by the County Board of Supervisors, acting as the legislative body of the District.

The Tax Rate Statement printed in this Pamphlet further describes the bonds and the special tax.

Governmental spending is restricted by the California Constitution, which provides for voter approval of an appropriations (i.e., expenditures) limit. This measure would establish the appropriations limit for the District equal to the proceeds of the special taxes described above.

"Resolution No. 282-2014" to which the ballot question refers is that same Resolution elsewhere entitled "A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz Authorizing Formation of Community Facilities District No. 2 of the County of Santa Cruz (Lompico Water), Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax Therein, Preliminarily Establishing an Appropriations Limit Therefor, Submitting Levy of the Special Tax and the Establishment of the Appropriations Limit to the Qualified Electors Thereof and Approving a Joint Community Facilities Agreement."

A "yes" vote on this measure is a vote to approve the bonds, the special tax, and establishment of the appropriations limit.

A "no" vote on this measure is against approving the bonds, the special tax, and the establishment of the appropriations limit.
