

**VOTE EARLY** 29 days before the election, Santa Cruz County Elections Department and Watsonville City Clerk's Office open as polling places.

Voters may pick up a ballot or vote there.

**WEEKEND VOTING** Vote on the weekend prior to the Election on February 28 & 29 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the following locations:

This is considered late absentee voting and is available to persons who are ill, disabled, or will be absent from their precinct on election dav.

Absentee voters who still have their ballots are encouraged to drop them off.

**VOTE BY MAIL** Voters may request a ballot to be mailed to them for this one election or for all future elections.

Submit written application (see back cover or online at www.votescount.com) by mail, FAX, online, or in person by 5 p.m. at least 7 days before Election Day.

The first day to mail ballots is 29 days before the election. Overseas and military personnel and dependents may obtain a ballot 60 days before the election - ask your commanding officer or go to www.votescount.com

## VOTE AT YOUR POLLING PLACE

Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m.

YOUR POLLING PLACE LOCATION MAY HAVE CHANGED from where you voted in the last election. Please refer to the back label to determine where you are assigned to vote.

If you are assigned to a mail ballot precinct, there are 250 or fewer voters in your area, so you will automatically be mailed a ballot.

CALIFORNIA'S MODIFIED CLOSED PRIMARY: For this primary election, if you are registered with the Democratic Party, you may **ONLY** vote a Democratic ballot. If you are registered with the Republican Party, you may ONLY vote a Republican ballot. And, the same goes for the other qualified political parties. HOWEVER, if you are not affiliated with a qualified political party, you may request and vote a ballot for the following political parties who have authorized you to do so: American Independent (full ballot), Democratic (ballot minus Central Committee), and Republican (ballot minus President and Central Committee) Call toll-free 1-800-345-VOTE for more information.
